Wood Badge Phases

Practical Phase:

- Two full 3-day weekends of training in the central themes
- A mid course patrol meeting to be scheduled by the patrol
- With Staff help, utilizing what you have learned, you will develop a “ticket” which is a set of personal goals designed to strengthen your commitment to Scouting

Application Phase:

- “Working your ticket”, allows 18 months to complete your ticket becoming proficient in your new skills
- Upon completion of the Wood Badge ticket you will be presented with the Wood Badge Beads

Wood Badge is designed to meet the advanced leadership needs of all unit Scouters: Cub Scout, Boy Scout, Venturing,

How do I qualify?

1. Be a registered member of the Boy Scouts of America.
2. Have completed the basic training courses for your current Scouting position.
3. Have completed the outdoor skills program, if there is one, appropriate for your Scouting position. Introduction to Outdoor Leadership Skills is required for Scoutmasters, Assistant Scoutmasters, and is suggested for Venturing leaders.
4. Have a complete and current BSA Annual Health and Medical Record completed prior to the start of the course.



Wood Badge Objectives

As a result of attending Wood Badge, participants will be able to:

- View Scouting globally, as a family of interrelated, values - based programs that provide age - appropriate activities for youth.
- Recognize the contemporary leadership concepts utilized in corporate America and leading government organizations.
- Apply the skills they learn from their participation as a member of a successful working team.
- Revitalize their commitment by sharing in an overall inspirational experience that helps provide Scouting with the leadership it needs to accomplish its mission on a ongoing basis.

Course fees will be \$210 before 4/1/2011. Fees include food, materials, and promotional items. \$60 nonrefundable deposit will be due with initial registration if prior to 4/1, \$95 after 4/1. \$150 remaining fees due by 8/12/2011.
